At District Nine's Conference in Grapevine, International President

Leanne Milligan spoke to the delegation about International's focus on growing the organization. Several items of interest were communicated:

*Reducing International dues by 50% for new members under the age of 30

*Create ASTRA Alumni to maintain communication with ASTRA members over 18 between leaving ASTRA and becoming Altrusans in the future.

*Develop Pathways to Leadership—a tool to match mentors and mentees with online forms.

*International is looking at ways to utilize social media presence to help leaders within Altrusa and to mentor current members. With the new website up and running, feel free to investigate all that is going on in this great organization.

- Updated Club President's Handbook is available on the Leadership page of the website.
- New member orientation PowerPoint presentation template available on the Membership page. Remember to edit the text and add images.
